First Reading Romans 12:1-8 Life in God's Service



Paul wrote in verses 4 and 5
We have many parts in the one body,

Reflection

One of Paul's favourite thoughts is to think of the Christian Church as a body. The members of the bodies neither argue with each other or envy each other or dispute about their relative importance.

Our world does not have to be divided between those with overt or (open) power and those oppressed by it. Instead, our world can be ordered by the using of all our gifts towards the benefit and wholeness of all. This text holds much good news and is as needed now as ever. What are the gifts our community might bring forward and celebrate?

God needs human hands through which healing is done, through which people are fed, and through which compassion is shown.

When our gifts are harnessed to the way of love and community well-being, we will be doing the will of God.

Lord, thank you for your faith in us, that you can use even us to be instruments of healing and peace.

Second Reading: Matthew 16: 13-20
Peter's Declaration about Jesus

Jesus said in verse 18

And so I tell you, Peter: you are a rock, and on this rock foundation I will build my church, and not even death will ever be able to overcome it.

Reflection

The end was coming very near, and Jesus needed as much time alone with his disciples as he could gain. He had so much to say to them, and so much more to teach them.

Jesus is interested in how the general public is receiving him and his message. More important to Jesus is how those who claim to be followers of his "way" understand his and their identity.

Who do we say Jesus is? How we answer that question will shape our lives. Peter did not have a faith-first revelation of who Jesus was; rather God through Jesus Christ made possible the revelation to Peter. From that moment, Peter received his blessing, and identity and his purpose.

To be a Christian means that through Jesus we too see the decisive revelation of God and what a life full of God looks like. Through that revelation we, who are the church, are given our identity as Christ's body in the world, and we are blessed and sent out to continue his work in the world.

God of love prepare our hands, our feet, our spirits and our hearts to do your work in the world in Christ's name.
